

Instructions for completing the application form

Note: The application will not be considered unless all sections have been filled in, and certified copies of all required documents have been enclosed.

Required documentation:

- Certified¹ copies² of the pages of your passport showing your picture, your full name, your date of birth and your nationality
 - Officially certified copies of all your educational certificates including:
 - Diploma/certificate from higher secondary education
 - Diploma/certificate/transcript from your college/university education
- 1) All copies must be attested as true copies of the original by a Norwegian Embassy/Consulate or by Notary Public or by a school/college/university administration and bear the name, signature and stamp of the official. Documents, which are not already in Norwegian, Danish, Swedish, English or German, must be accompanied by an authorised translation of the original.
 - 2) Applicants are asked to submit copies only, not originals. Students who are admitted must be able to present originals. Students failing to present originals upon request may be denied admission.

English language requirements can be documented by one of the following:

Native language e.g. citizens from Australia, New Zealand, Canada, Ireland, UK and USA, TOEFL test results must be 170 (500 paper-based test) or better, IELTS test results must be 5.0 or better, English from higher secondary school in Norway, Advanced Placement International English Language examination (APIEL) with 3 points or better, Following certificates from University of Cambridge: Certificate of Proficiency in English, Certificate in Advanced English, First Certificate in English, Michigan English Language Assessment Battery (MELAB) with a minimum of 85 points, A minimum of one-year full time studies in Australia, New Zealand, Canada, Ireland, UK or USA (The language of instruction must be English), Applicants from African countries with A-level examinations in English, passed with the grade "C" or better.

Financing your studies at the Norwegian University of Life Sciences (UMB):

Tuition at UMB is subsidized by the Norwegian Government with no tuition for the individual student. The exemption is a minor compulsory membership in the University Foundation for Student Life in Ås of NOK 240 at the beginning of each semester. However, students are responsible for the payment of all other expenses. For this reason the Norwegian Immigration Authorities (UDI) requires a guarantee that you will be able to provide for all expenses while studying in Norway. UDI will expect that you can provide a sum of app. NOK 80.000 per year to cover accommodation cost and board, clothing, transport, study material, medical and dental care, semester fees and other necessities.

Residence permit and Visa:

In order to study in Norway, international students must obtain a student residence permit. This permit must be obtained before leaving the student's home country. A Norwegian Embassy or Consulate will provide the necessary application form and information. Processing time is normally 2-4 months. It is not possible to apply for a student residence permit while staying in Norway on a tourist visa or short visit visa. A student visa is not a residence permit for immigration to Norway, and must be renewed every year. Renewal is subject to the student following normal progress expected in the programme. All non-Nordic international students need a residence permit if they intend to stay in Norway for more than 3 months. As a general rule, the residence permit should have been applied for and granted before the student arrives in Norway, irrespective of whether a visa is needed or not. However, there is an exception to these regulations if the student is a citizen in an EEA country. EEA students must bring an E-111 medical and can then apply for a student residence permit within 7 days of their arrival in Norway. To obtain a student residence permit you must 1) be accepted as a student, 2) document that you have a place to stay and 3) document that you have NOK 80.000 in a Norwegian bank account. As it is difficult to open a bank account from abroad, the university has an agreement with the immigration authorities that NOK 80.000, as an alternative can be deposited in the university account until the student arrives in Norway. This is a service the university provides for international students. If you wish to use this service, the funds must be placed with the university by June 1.

ADMISSION REGULATIONS AT THE AGRICULTURAL UNIVERSITY OF NORWAY (UMB)

Chapter 5. Admission to Higher-degree Study Programmes (2-year Master's Degrees)

§ 5-1 The minimum requirement for admission to a master's programme is a bachelor's or a cand.mag degree, or an equivalent study programme consisting of at least 180 study points (ECTS).

§ 5-3 Applicants are ranked according to their average grade from previous education.

§ 5-4 For admission to all master's programmes, applicants are required to document sufficient English language skills.

§ 5-5 Admission to master's programmes is coordinated. Applicants can apply to a maximum of five prioritised master's programmes.
